Session Wrap-Up at Sen. Zenzinger ‘Coffee’ Event

In new start time, participants will hear final legislative run-down



ARVADA, Colo. (April 22, 2014) – Colorado Senator Rachel Zenzinger will devote her monthly “Coffee with Constituents” to general discussion and Q&A about legislative issues May 8 with a focus on summarizing the five months that the legislature was in session.

The coffee meeting at the Indian Tree Golf Course Club House in Arvada, with a new starting time of 7:30 a.m., comes a day following the official end of the session.

After opening remarks, Sen. Zenzinger will encourage participants to set the agenda and express their concerns on issues of greatest priority. At some point, she will provide information about the conclusion of various bills, including those covering the “Three E’s” (education, economy, elders).

The “Coffee with Constituents” is held the second Thursday of every month at Indian Tree; and it is intended to provide an informal alternative to the monthly Town Hall meetings that Sen. Zenzinger conducts on the third Saturday of every month. In both meetings, members of the public are welcome to ask questions and provide input. The “Coffee with Constituents” is more of a round-table event, and it will end at 8:30 a.m. The start and end is a half-hour later than it was while the legislative session was in progress.

While anyone from the public may attend the meeting, the content will generally focus on issues that most affect residents of Senate District 19, which Sen. Zenzinger serves. The Indian Tree Golf Course is at

7555 Wadsworth Blvd., Arvada, CO 80003. Coffee will be available, but attendees will be required to purchase their own breakfast.

She was appointed to her seat and sworn into office on Dec. 13, 2013. She serves on the Senate Education Committee, Senate Local Government Committee and she is a Senate advisor to the Colorado Commission on Higher Education.
